SHAI FELDMAN is a senior research fellow at the Center for Science and International Affairs (CSIA) at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. For the previous decade and a half, he was a senior research associate at Tel Aviv University's Jaffee Center for Strategic Studies where, beginning in 1989, he directed the Project on Regional Security and Arms Control in the Middle East.
