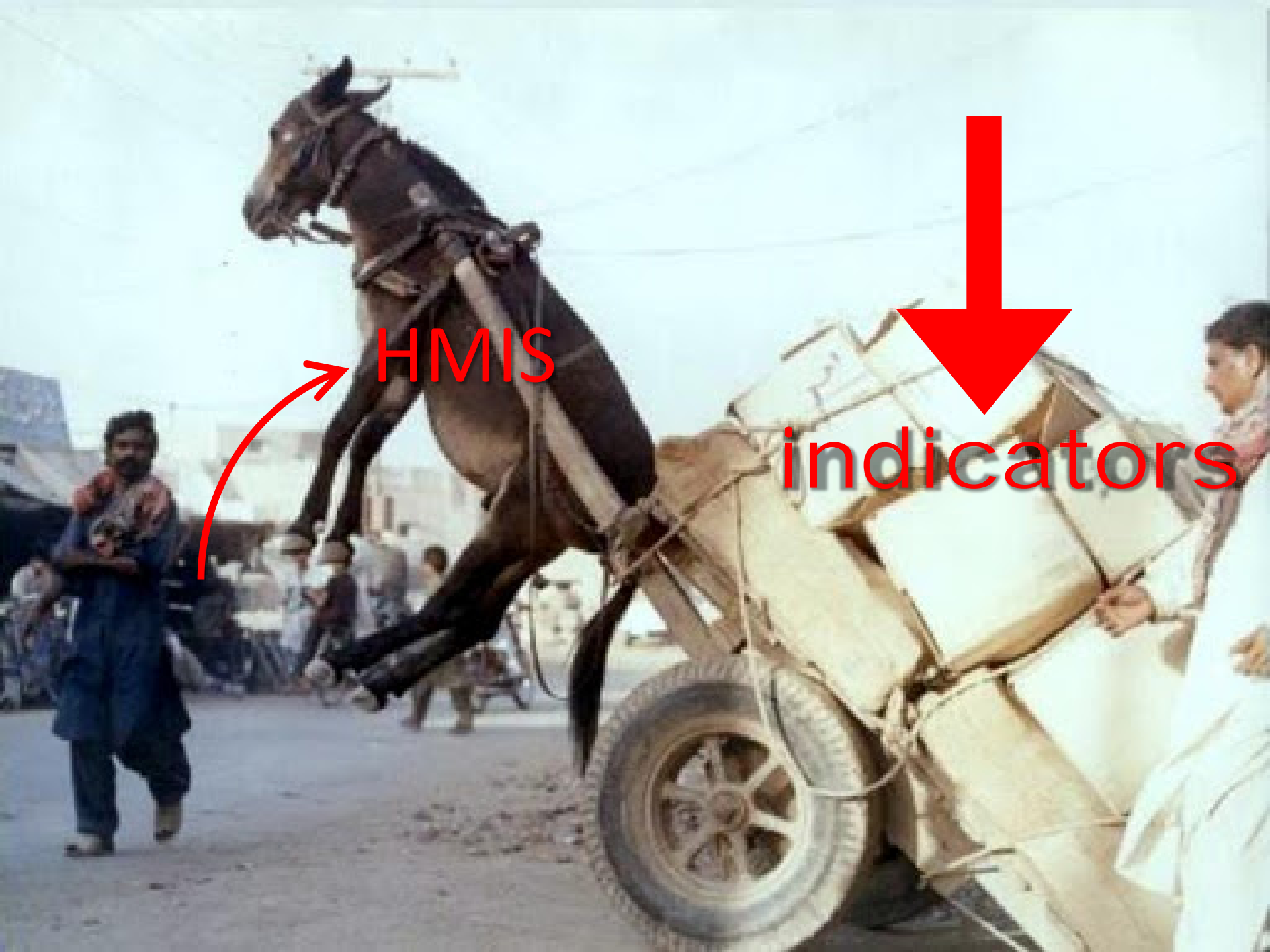

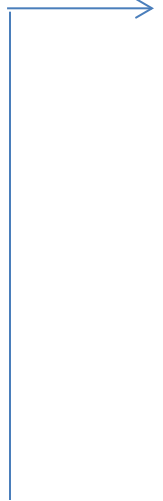

5.4 Adolescent birth rate

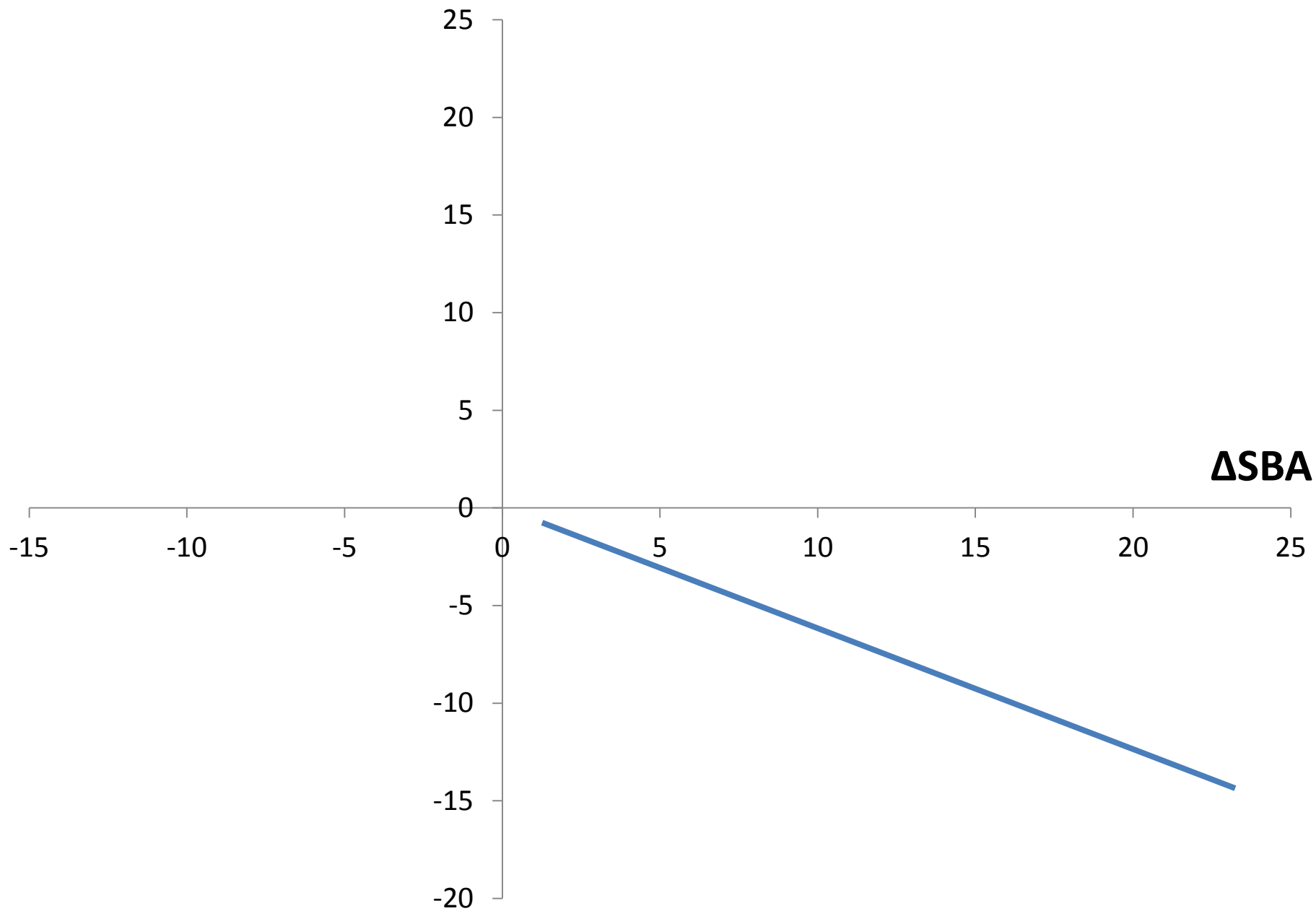
5.5 Antenatal care coverage (at least one visit and at least four visits)

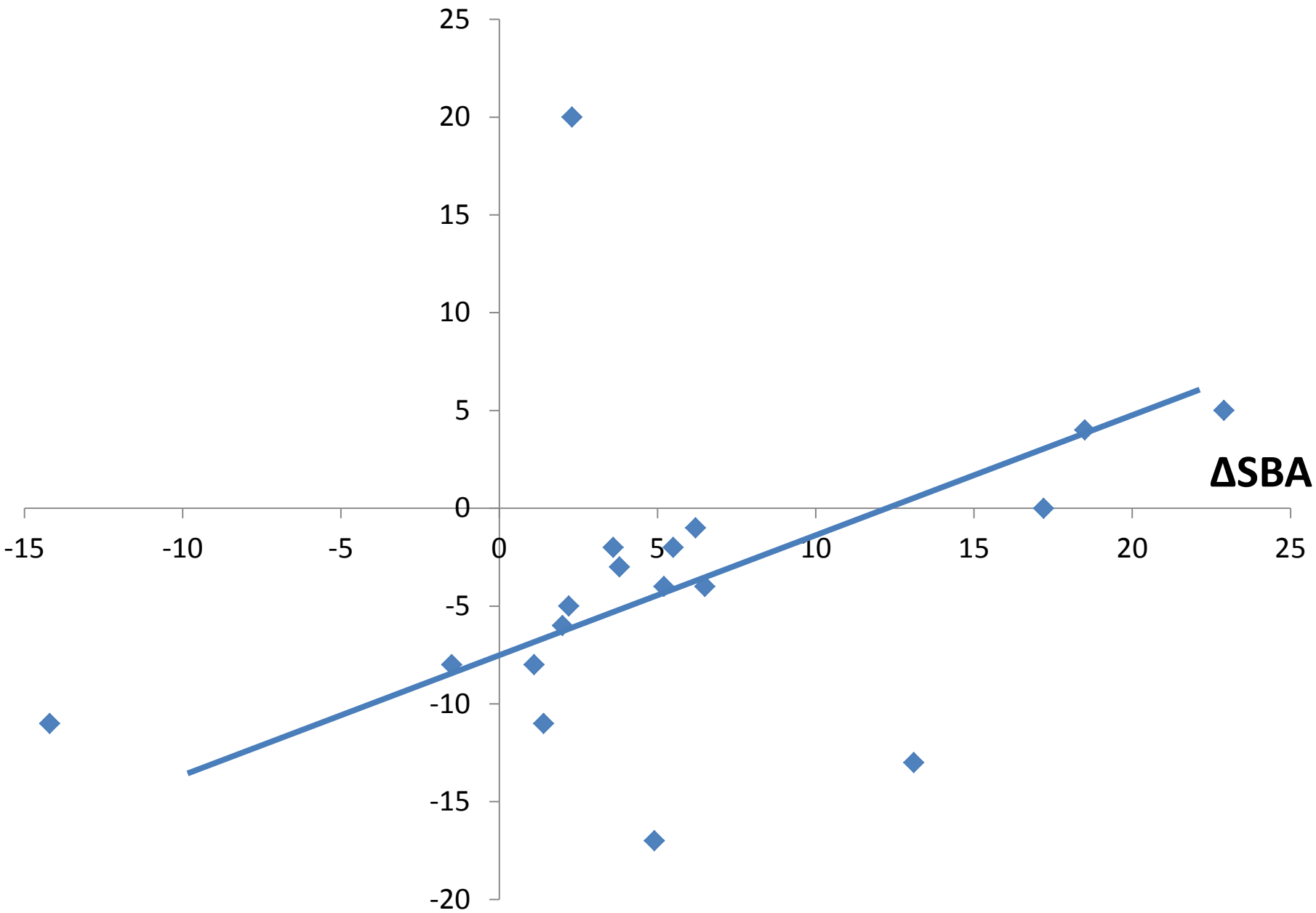
