NEW PROPOSAL FOR "FLEXIBLE MANUFACTURING"

Many members of the Congressional Clearinghouse on the Future have expressed interest in the development of high technology and manufacturing industries — areas frequently highlighted as foundations for America's long-term economic strength. The enclosed bill and related materials outline a proposal designed to aid in that development.

The JOINT MANUFACTURING OPPORTUNITIES ACT (H.R. 423) suggests limited changes in antitrust law in order to foster joint manufacturing and shared research and development efforts. The proposal carefully balances traditional concerns about monopoly power and emerging concerns about the need for new forms of cooperative effort in the American economy. The innovative proposal enjoys bipartisan support, and many Clearinghouse members may prove interested.

The enclosed "dear colleague" letter and other materials offer extensive background about H.R. 423. Clearinghouse member Ron Wyden initially introduced the bill with 6 original cosponsors, and as of January 27, another 11 Members have joined as cosponsors of the bill.
