

Political Participation in Brazil

People who do not identify as white make up 53% of the Brazilian population. In the general election in 2014, they represented 44% of total candidates










White (55.63%) Mixed-Race (34.47%)

Afro-Brazilian (9.10%) Asian-Brazilian (0.46%)


Indigenous (0.34%)

State Legislatures












The Senate is the exception

Federal Senate

Fewer candidates of color ran for a seat in the Federal Senate (the upper chamber) than ran for state governor







There was only one presidential candidate of color (out of 11) in 2014:
 Marina Silva.

She is a pre-candidate for the 2018 elections.
