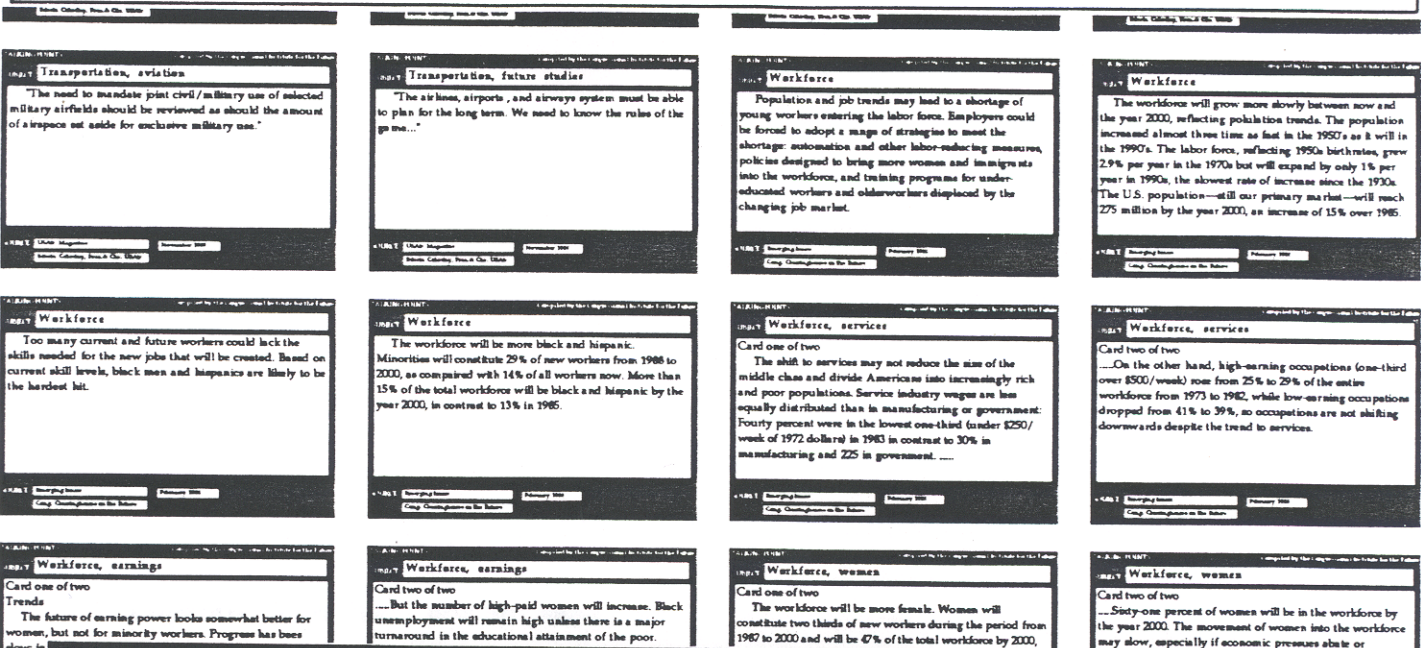

SUBJECT Family issues

What for years was considered the family norm—a working father, a housewife mother, and two or more school aged children—has virtually vanished. In 1955, 60 percent of U.S. households fit that norm, but in just three decades, the percentage of American families that fit the Ozzie and Harriet mold shrank to a tiny 7 percent.
