FIDEL HERRERA BELTRÁN was elected governor of the Mexican state of Veracruz in 2004. As a member of the Institutional Revolutionary Party (PRI), he served in the Mexican Congress four times, where he led diplomatic delegations to international conferences in Europe, Africa, and Latin America. He also headed a Mexican delegation to the United States to lobby for greater Mexican sugar exports as part of NAFTA. As a senator representing Veracruz, he was president of the Legislative Studies Commission and the Sugar Industry Commission. Born in Veracruz, Mexico, Governor Herrera Beltrán earned his law degree from Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM) and received his master's degree from the University of Veracruz.
