Equivalence of Food Safety Systems for Meat and Poultry Products



Overview of the initiative

Objective:

- Ensure public health goals are met by enhanced information sharing
- Reduce where possible, certain specific regulatory requirements as they pertain to inspection and reinspection activities

Deliverable/Outcome:

Streamline requirements and simplify associated administrative procedures for products produced under Canada and U.S. equivalent meat and poultry product inspection systems



Progress update

Action Item 1:

- Streamline requirements and procedures related to equivalence
- **Current Status:**
- Canada/U.S. are drafting a side-by-side comparison in order to determine equivalence
- Undertaking further analysis on areas of mutual interest



Progress update

Action Item 2:

Establish a mechanism to maintain and promote continued alignment

Current Status:

- Terms of Reference have been finalized to establish a senior level commitment between CFIA and FSIS
- This action item will be refined as necessary over the coming months.



Next steps and key issues

Next Steps

➢CFIA and FSIS will complete the side-by-side review by Fall 2013.

 \succ The goal of this review is to identify and eliminate redundant requirements on both sides.

>Harmonization of requirements where possible.



Meat and Poultry Product Certification



Overview of the initiative

Objective:

To reduce or eliminate redundant certification requirements, data elements and administrative procedures for shipments flowing between Canada and the U.S.

Deliverable/Outcome:

Streamline the meat and poultry certification process



Progress update

Action Item:

Streamline/eliminate certification requirements and procedures

Current Status:

CFIA and FSIS are jointly assessing areas where certification could be simplified



Next steps and key issues

Further discussion between Canada and the U.S. to identify opportunities to simplify certification and eliminate outdated and redundant requirements

Continued discussion with APHIS on requirement for veterinary signature

Collaboration with FSIS on e-Cert efforts to facilitate CFIA progress in this area



Process for the next three months for ongoing alignment work

- Current collaboration is a good foundation for future work and provides a starting point for deeper regulatory cooperation.
- Work undertaken to date has been exploratory in nature and could form part of a more systemic approach in the future.
