## Speakers' Bios

Chris Garman is a director at Eurasia Group, the head of its Latin America practice, and the lead analyst on Brazil. He has conducted extensive field research in Brazil, and has published articles in World Politics, Latin America Research Review, and the Brazilian Journal of Political Economy. Mr. Garman previous worked as a senior political analyst at Tendencias Consultoria Integrada, Brazil's largest economic and political consulting firm. He has researched Brazilian central bank politics and federalism. Chris earned an MA in political science from the University of California, San Diego, where he is currently a PhD candidate.

Ana María Sanjuán is a sociology professor at Universidad Central de Venezuela and a board member for the Center for the Study of America. Her topics of expertise include democracy, human rights, human security, and governability. She has consulted on these topics for over 15 years for institutions such as the World Bank, Inter-American Development Bank, and United Nations Development Programme. She holds a BA in social psychology and a doctorate in political science from Universidad Central de Venezuela.

Roger Tissot is an independent consultant with Gas Energy Latin America, and assistant to companies and governments on energy strategies and policy issues. He was previously Director for Latin America for PFC Energy, a Washington consulting firm specialized on global energy issues. Roger was responsible for economic, political and energy policy analysis of Latin America. Mr. Tissot has also worked for EnCana Corporation, a Canadian oil and gas company, where he developed tools for above ground risk analysis which the company implemented for their investment strategies in Latin America and Africa. He is the co-author of *Petroleum Industry in Latin America* and *Natural Gas industry in Latin America*. Mr. Tissot holds a master of economics from Laval University and an MBA from the University of Calgary.

**Duncan Wood** is Director of the Undergraduate Program in International Relations and acting head of the Department of International Studies at the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM). He directs the Canadian Studies Program and researches at ITAM's Centro de Derecho Económico Internacional (CDEI), and is also technical secretary of the Red Mexicana de Energía, a group of energy policy experts. His research includes Mexican energy sector reform, Latin American energy policy, and migration and remittances. He has published on banking supervision, North American relations, and Latin American oil companies. Wood holds a BA in politics from Leicester University, an MA in political science from McMaster University, and a Ph.D. in political studies from Queen's University.
