Jim Doyle is Wisconsin's 44th Governor, first elected in 2002 and then re-elected in 2006 with more votes than any candidate for governor in Wisconsin history. Until becoming governor, he served three four-year terms as Wisconsin's Attorney General, distinguishing himself as a national leader in fighting to improve public health and in aggressively prosecuting state polluters.
