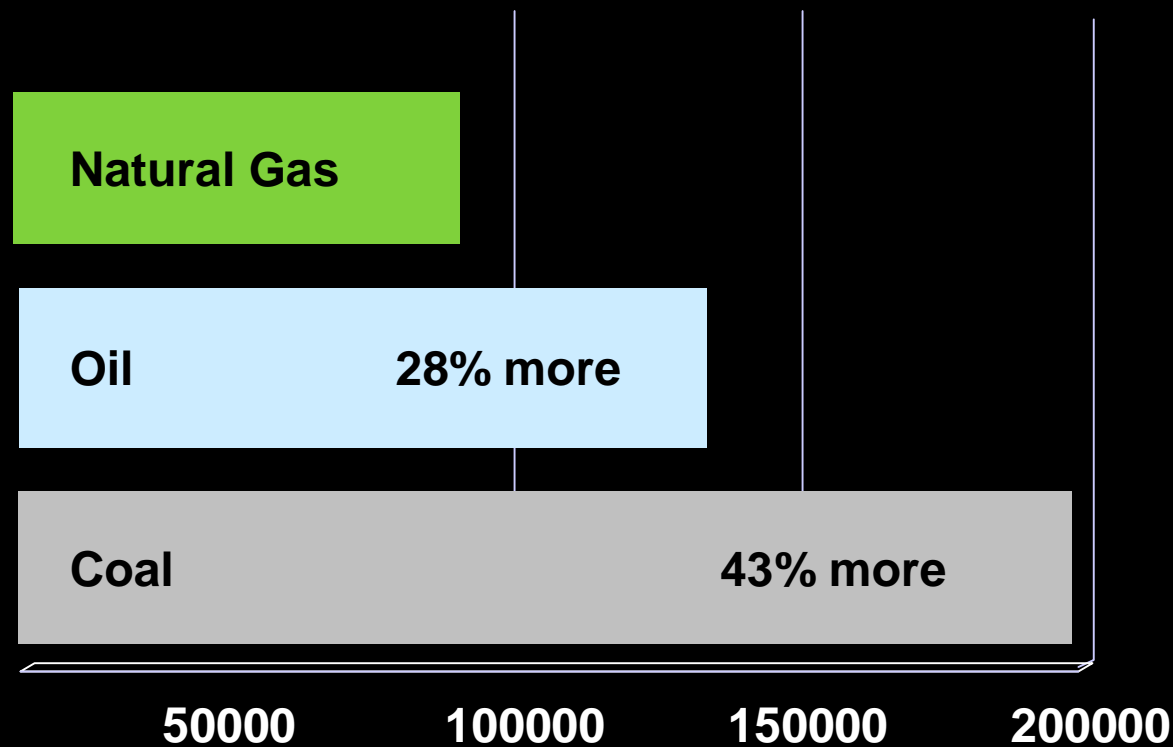

CARBON EMISSIONS BY FUEL TYPE

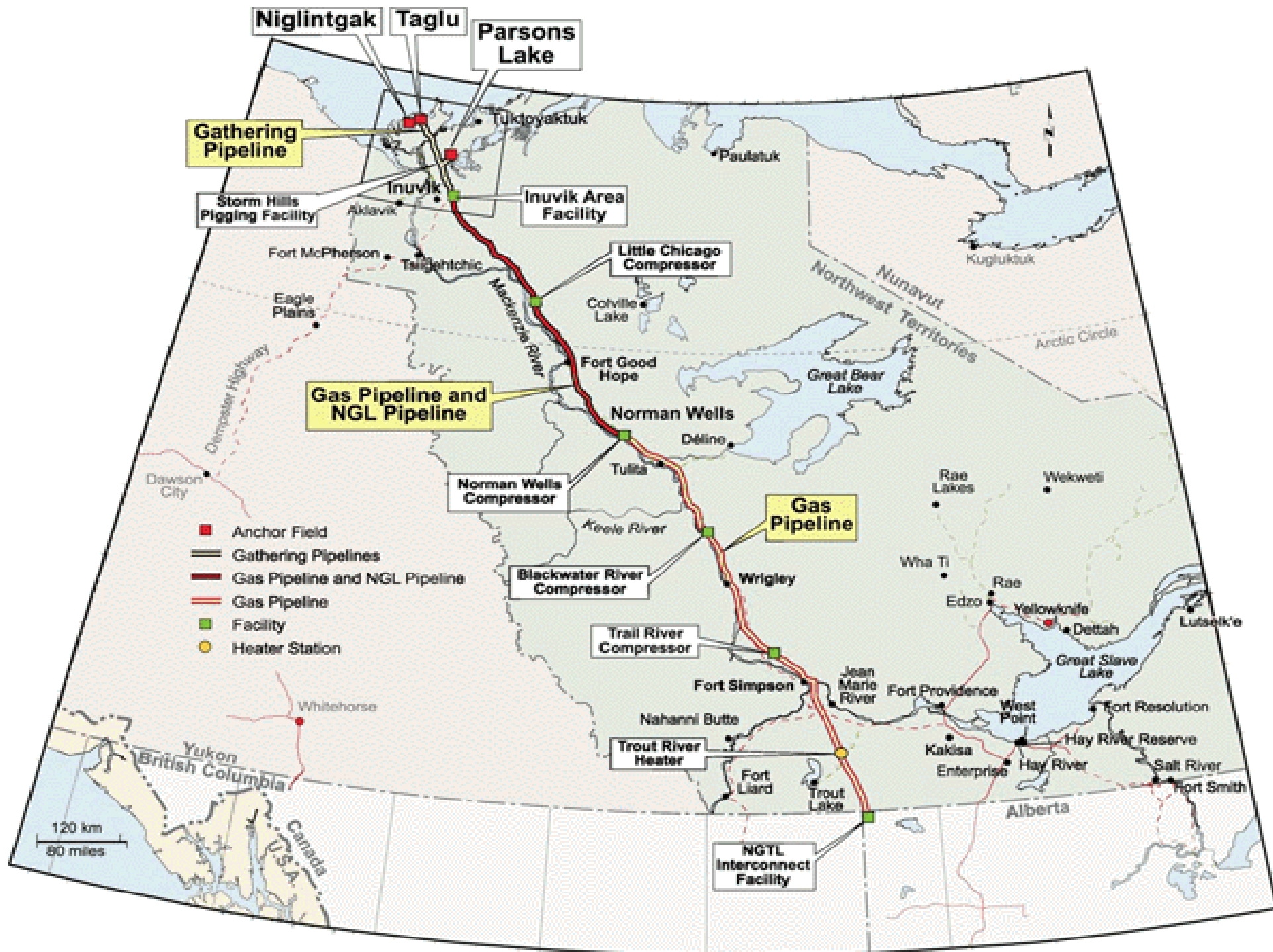
Natural Gas is Cleanest

Pounds per Billion Btu of Energy Consumed





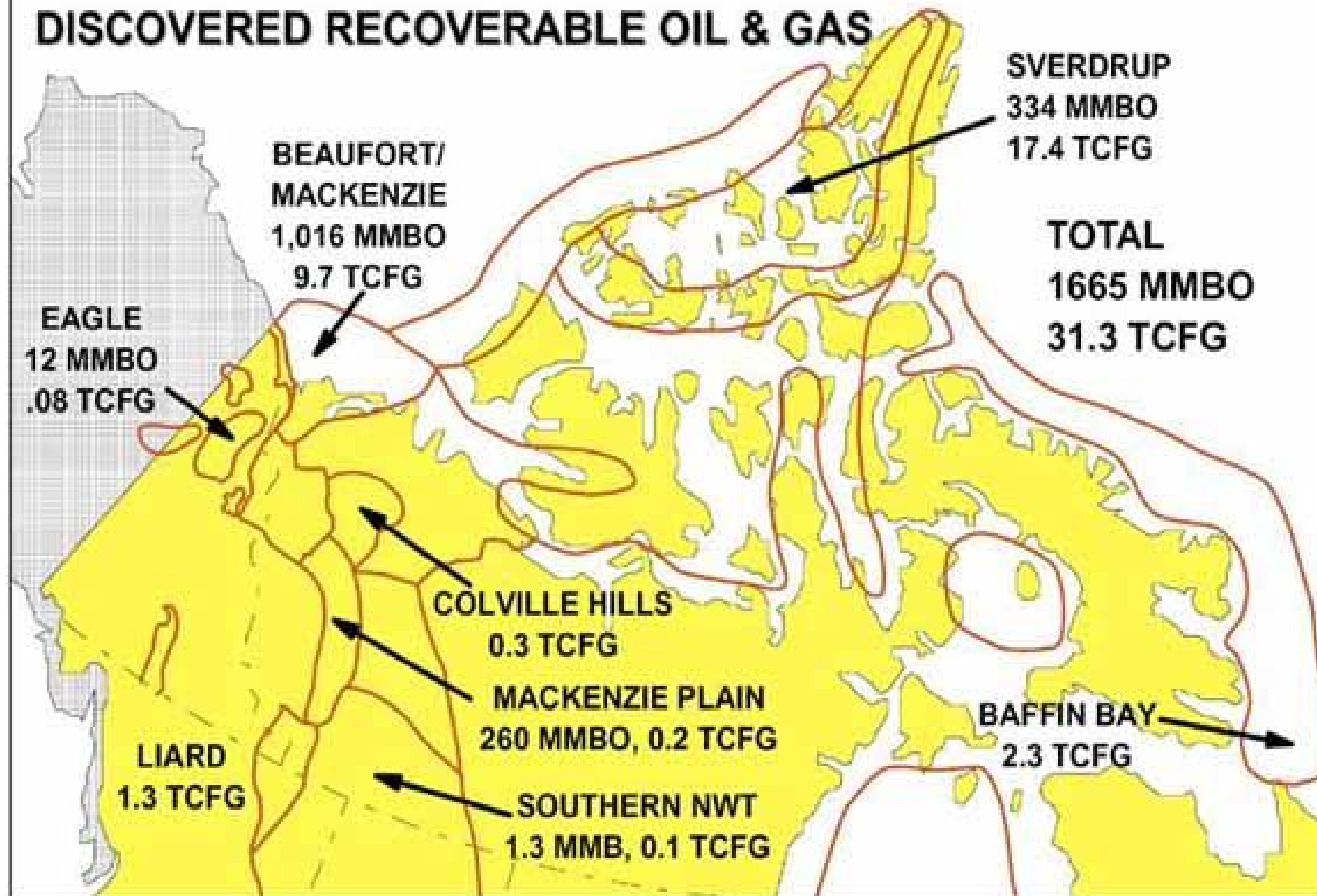

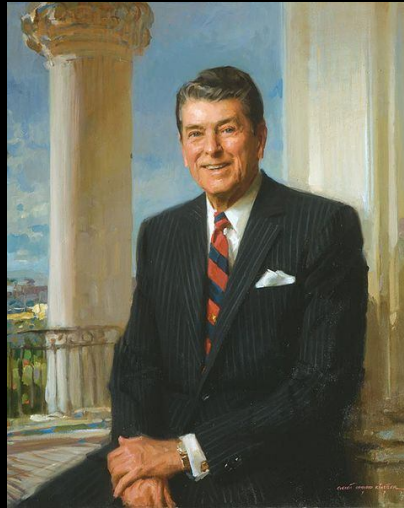




TransCanada, Exxon Mobil Join in Alaska Pipeline Plan

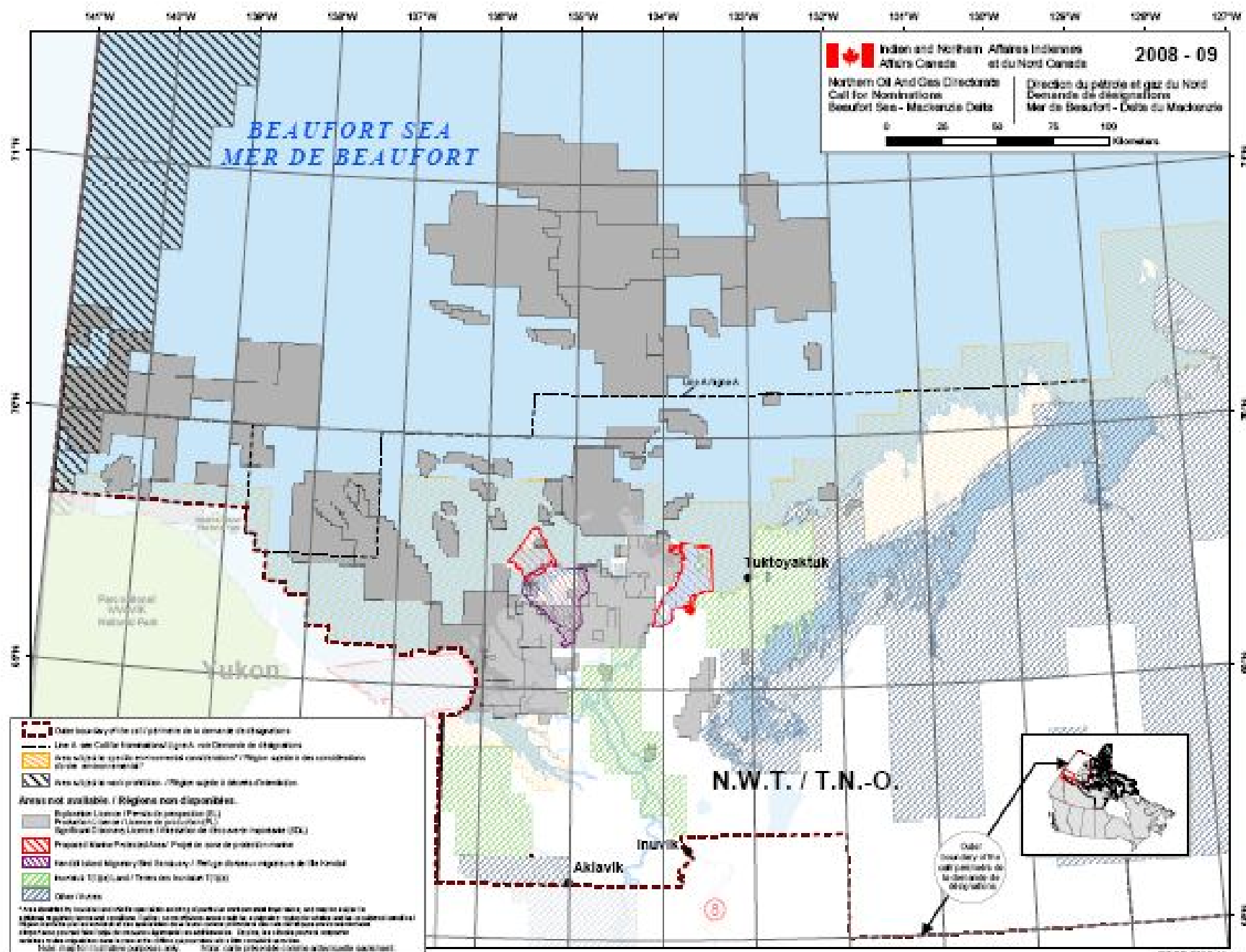
Mackenzie Valley; Washington offers US\$18-billion in loan guarantees

Ottawa needs to step up and support the Mackenzie Valley natural gas pipeline in the same way Washington is propping up the Alaska gas effort with billions of dollars of loan guarantees if Canada ever wants to see its own Arctic gas aspirations come to fruition, a Northwest Territories official says.

Bob McLeod, the Northwest Territories' Minister of Industry, Tourism, and Investment, kicks off a three-day fact-finding mission in Washington today, with hopes of sorting out precisely what the U. S. government is prepared to do to move the Alaska gas line ahead, and then take that information back to Ottawa.

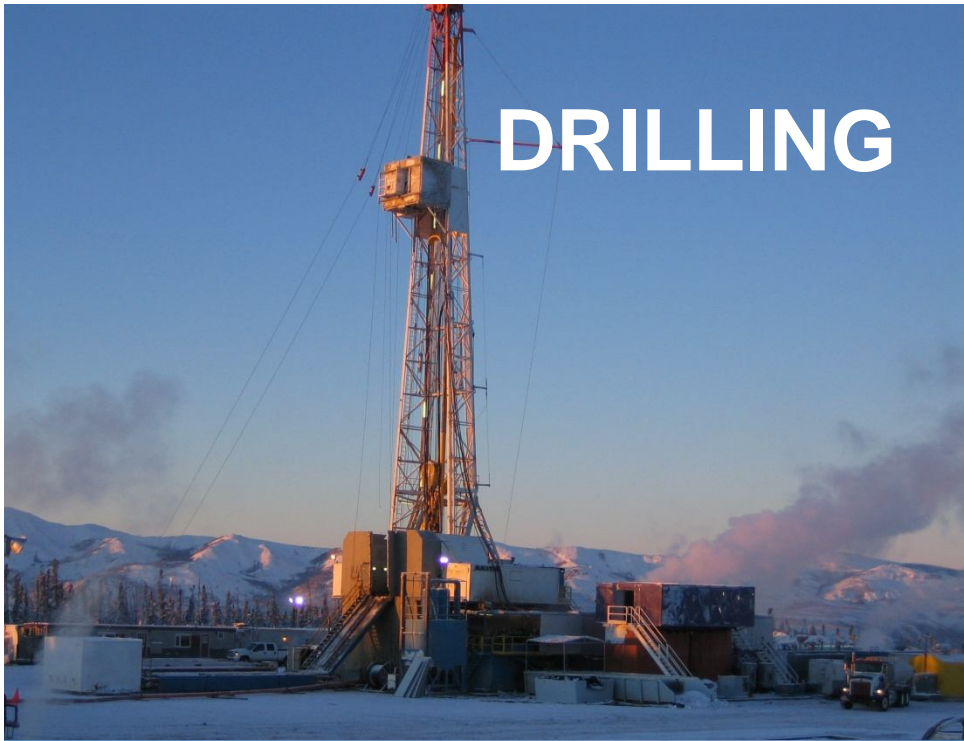
