# Scarcity of evidence on Sexual Violence in conflict settings

Challenges are both methodological and ethical

 Mixed methods are needed (population based surveys, service based, participatory research, etc.)



# Congolese women are completely unprotected

- Complete impunity
- Lack of services for medical, psycho social care

 Stigma against survivors of sexual violence creates further isolation, trauma



### Rape as "normal" behavior

 Increasing civilian perpetrators

 May last for many generations (ex. Cambodia)

### The "production" of violent boys and men

 Need to address gender norms and violence with men and boys to "unlearn" violent behavior





### Key issues for moving forward in addressing sexual violence against women in DRC

- Services for survivors –
- Prevention of violence, rehabilitation

  - Changing gender norms
  - Involve all members of the community
