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








What do we know?

How Does Conflict Affect Food Security?

- In all dimensions:
 - Availability
 - Access
 - Utilization
 - Stability, certainty
- Invariably leads to increased food *insecurity*
- With both short-term and long-term effects

How Does Food Insecurity Contribute to Conflict?

- Triggers conflict responses
- Catalyzes action
- Builds momentum toward engagement
- Provides incentives to support
- Sustains conflict

- Replacing and restructuring institutions of governance
- Helping households recover
- Mobilizing civil society and the private sector
- Understanding what's going on
