The Issue: Sexual Violence in Conflict



"These are not random acts of violence in the theatre of war, but a deliberate attempt to dehumanize and destroy entire communities." - UN Secretary General, October 2007



Where IRC Works





IRC at a glance

- 350-400 survivors per month
- 75-85% report perpetrators are members of armed groups
- One-quarter are under 18
- Periods of relative calm, interrupted by cyclical, brutal violence







IRC's GBV Program

Seeks to promote the wellbeing of women and girls and mitigate the immediate and long-term effects of gender-based violence (GBV) against women and girls in North and South Kivu







GBV Program in DRC



- Over 40,000 survivors assisted
- Sustainable partnership with 7 national NGOs and 40 CBOs
- ♦ 600 women in economic empowerment activities











Going to Scale

2002

- \$500,000 for 1 year
- 6-7 partners
- Focus on essential services
- 2-3 international NGOs doing GBV

2010

- \$13.5 million for 3 years
- Over 40 partners
- Comprehensive programming
- Countless NGOs doing GBV

CHALLENGE: How do you scale up effectively?





Challenges: Bridging gap between rhetoric and reality

Expectations

- Services provided across Eastern DRC with \$15-20 million
- Everyone knows how to address GBV
- Rape is stopped

FACT: IRC has one of the largest GBV programs in Congo. GBV programs only comprise 4% of IRC's overall budget in Congo.

<u>Reality</u>

- Essential services alone require enormous investment
- No common understanding of comprehensive programming
- Prevention is long-term and requires political will

Develop a common understanding about what a comprehensive GBV program is and what it takes to implement it

Support more multi-year, robust GBV programs that will respond to the scale of the problem

Leverage resources going into other sectors by ensuring GBV is integrated
