




USAID Policy on Youth in Development (2012)

Policy Goal: USAID will improve the capacities and enable the aspirations of youth so that they can contribute to and benefit from more stable, democratic, and prosperous communities and nations.

Objectives:

- Strengthen youth programming, participation and partnership in support of Agency development objectives
- Mainstream and integrate youth issues and engage young people across Agency initiatives and operations.





Achieving the Demographic Dividend

- USAID advocates for cross-sector approaches to adolescent and youth sexual and reproductive health.
- Investments in FP, reproductive health, girls' education, and child survival lower fertility rate.
- Lower fertility produces a larger working age population and a smaller dependent population: the demographic dividend.




