



AN OVERVIEW OF IL NGWESI




- A community owned land (group ranch) and managed by Il Laikipak maasai
- 634 registered members representing total of 7000 population









Location: Laikipia district of Rift valley Province, covers 16,500 acres (8,695Htr) & 80% of the land used for conservation




COMMUNITY PROJECTS UNDER IL NGWESI

- Awareness on TB




ENVIRONMENT/RESOURCE CONFLICT MANAGEMENT

- Help the government law enforcement agencies-Chiefs, police force,




ECTOURISM

ECO TOURISM IN ILNGWESI

- IL NGWESI BANDAS established in 1996,
- Funded by USAID through COBRA.
- Six cottages with 12 beds
- With 20 employees, 99% coming from the local community
- Run by the community them self
- Big source of income in Il Ngwesi
- Revenue from the project goes the community.






ILNGWESI REVENUE CHART 1999-2007



YEARLY REVENUE DISTIBUTION

- Education ksh 1.2 million every year on needy children bursaries & teachers salaries

 VCTs (1,019 tested & over 3000
 counseled in 2007) (2008 in progress
- Conservation and security Ksh2million yearly
- Support of IGAS for the community
 - 2007 Ksh 200,000
- Infrasacture


2007- Water-Ksh 300 000

- Community owned idea and community led programme
- Developed management systems.
- Participatory decision making process.
- Developed capacity in committees
- Maasai cultural values
- Equity revenue distribution
- Support from partners and friends



SUCCESS STORIES

- Development of the Ecolodge
- Introduction of black rhino after 30yrs of diminishing
 - Introduction of white rhino in the region
- Award wining
 - -Winner of the 2002 UNDP equator initiative (community reducing poverty through biodiversity conservation)
 - Winner of first choice responsible tourism awards 2006
 - 2007 Global Vision Award
- Stopping Cattle rustling/Provide security of people
- Creation of employment (48ppl) (99% from the community)
- A good example for other communities (17 other communities had started similar project)
- 2006 Il Ngwesi leaders declaration on HIV AIDS
- Introduction of holistic management of the conservation area.



CHALLENGES

- Human wildlife conflict
- Tourism marketing
- Population growth
- Conflict between the old & young generation
- Poor representation in higher government level in decision making
- Capacity of committees members
- Inadequate resources
- Inadequate infrastructure
- Threats from international Terrorism on tourism
- May 2007 court rule on the case over Il Ngwesi (105million)
- Political instability in the country
