- New growth in peri-urban areas



“Estuarial ecosystems have distinct characteristics that represent something more than the shift from land to ocean. They bring together elements of fresh water with the cycles and tides of the open ocean.”

- Rapid Mixing of population ‘types’:
 - Long term residents
 - Newly if poorly ‘urbanised’
 - The ‘suburbanised’
- Mix of translocal economic strategies
- Mix of regulatory systems and authority structures


How has policy addressed these areas?

- Conventional policy responses tend to homogenize
- Retrofit informal areas within formal rules
- Increasing the burden of the poor and marginalized



Gateways of opportunity?

- Important 'toehold' in the city
- Important supply channel for housing and land
- Sophisticated systems of land management – technically illegal, but socially legitimate
