





China Rivers Projects' Goals

- facilitate the enjoyment of rivers and understanding of the broad value of free flowing rivers in China


























Big Dam Decision Making in China







Great Bendof the Yangtze River
March 22-29, 2009










































Li Yuan Dam Site

June-August, 2009: Tongtian River, Qinghai (2-3 trips)


October: Upper Yellow River Second Descent, Gansu
