

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

#### TFR in selected African Countries




#### Population Trends - Africa

#### • Currently:

- 31 of 34 countries with TFR of 5+ are in SSA
- About 14m unintended pregnancies occur each yr
- While >2/3 of women use FP in all regions, only ¼
   do so in Africa
- At least 25% of women 15-49 have unmet need for FP
- Stall in fertility transition casts doubt on medium variant projections for Africa
- Over the next 40 years:
  - Africa's population will double from 1 to 2 billion
  - Africa will account for 22% of world population, up




