

- Support midwives as main providers of essential MNC including Basic Emergency Obstetric and Newborn Care (BEmONC)
- Advocate on global level for midwifery (in collaboration with UNFPA, WHO, UNICEF, ICM, ACNM, and FIGO)



Education and Training

- Pre-service education (PSE)
 - Tanzania, Haiti, Ghana
 - E-learning, training simulators, competency-based assessment tools, faculty development
- In-service training (IST)
 - Burma, Rwanda, Ethiopia
 - Promote midwives as trainers and trainees
 - Advocate for inclusion of midwives in beta testing of new training packages
