

Disrupting Money Laundering by Mexican Transnational Organized Crime

Money Laundering is a huge problem, but how much?

There is a great deal we don't know, like:

 The overall volume of the illegal drug trade between Mexico and the U.S.?

 How much "dirty" money is brought back to Mexico? (NDIC says Mexico is the "primary placement area" for US generated dirty money. Others say 20%. How much is transferred back electronically, in bulk cash, and through trade-based money laundering – via commercial transactions that appear legitimate but either over or under value the amount being shipped?

Cash Seizures

- According to the U.S. National Drug Intelligence Center (NDIC), bulk cash seizures in the U.S. totaled \$798 million from January 2008 through August 2010 (approximately \$25 million per month)
- Since 2002, Mexico has seized over \$457.5
 million in bulk currency shipments. In 2010, bulkcash seizures amounted to US \$32.4 million and
 87.3 million Mexican pesos (approximately \$7
 million) amounting to some US\$ 39.4 million.

Cash Seizures

 Given that Mexican authorities seized USD 39.4 million in 2010, Mexico was only able to capture approximately 0.20 percent of drug-trafficking revenue at its lowest estimate and 1.13 percent at its highest.
