In his new book, *That Little Infernal Cuban Republic: The United States and the Cuban Revolution*, political scientist **Lars Schoultz** of the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill argues that despite the overwhelming asymmetry between the United States and Cuba, Cubans' historical insistence on their right to self-determination has influenced both U.S. domestic politics and foreign affairs. Schoultz argues that a policy of "benevolent domination" has produced a diplomatic impasse of unprecedented longevity.

Schoultz will be joined by **Tomás Bilbao** of the non-partisan Washington-based Cuba Study Group, to discuss contemporary U.S. policies toward Cuba and the domestic and international factors shaping the possibilities for a new bilateral relationship.
