

Age-structural Transition


Country-level population age structures


## Zone of instability:


- high risk of civil conflict

- high risk of losing FH's "Free" status





Direction of the

Country-level population age structures











# Fertility by Background Characteristics






### The Youth Bulge Dilemma:

1. SHORT TERM Goal: Immediate end to armed conflict. [men's agenda]


1. THE DILEMMA: Are they compatible?
