


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Seattle Missions-- Six underlying goals:

- Develop the most sophisticated civic leadership in our country on international issues

 Vancouver

Some lessons from learning cities

- Knowledge systems...
 - Felt need for transformation
 - Are longer term, more strategic
 - Created an agency with tight focus
 - Pro-Active, participatory
 - Outbound (they go see it)
 - Invest in knowledge and capacity building

Summing up (and looking ahead)

- Urban Brazil opens a window into details
- Covers important dimensions, not all are subject to policy (public entrepreneurship; continuity)
- Latent and patent demand for learning
 - Local governments rights in European Charter
 - City regions asserting identity in European Constitution
- Global cities the next feature on the geopolitical landscape
