
The Importance of Tenure Security in Home Improvement in Squatter Settlements: Evidence from Lahore

No. of Informal Settlements: Approx. 350

Research Questions

- How is housing improvement in squatter settlements linked to tenure security?
 - What role does tenure regularization play in catalyzing home improvement in squatter settlements?
 - How do different kinds of tenure security affect home improvement?

Land Tenure & Home Improvement

Argument I:

- Tenure security is contingent on property rights manifested through legal titles.
- Property titles are important in unleashing housing improvement in squatter settlements.

Argument II:

- Tenure security is based on perception of security.
- Housing improvement occurs when residents perceive security of tenure even in the absence of property titles.


Research Design

- Case study
- Data sources
 - Interviews
 - Direct observations

Shamspura

- ▶ First inhabited in late 1970s
- ▶ Regularized in 2004
- Households belonging to various kinds of land tenure
- Bounded by River Ravi, railway tracks, major highway and roadway
- > 200 households before highway construction
- ~100 households in 2010

Shamspura Tenure Security Continuum



Findings

Perception of tenure security in Shamspura rests on:

- Government's legalization process
 - Surveys undertaken by govt. officials
 - Information disseminated by local revenue officers
- Residents' contact w/ elected officials (MPAs)
- Provision of utilities & infrastructure by the govt.
- Number of residents in settlement
 - Access to informal mechanisms of obtaining utilities
 - Getting local elected official's attention
 - Self-help program
- Neighborhood leader

Findings

- Obtaining a property title is unaffordable
- "Government will do whatever it wants whenever it wants to anyone"
- Residents improved homes incrementally over time regardless of their legal tenure status

A more flexible system of tenure regularization that is based on residents' need of tenure recognition and prevents bribery.
