
Profile on South Sudan

The Republic of South Sudan is the world's newest country, having gained its independence from Sudan in 2011.

The ongoing civil war that began in December 2013 is estimated to have taken the lives of over 10,000 South Sudanese and displaced more than one million people.

The Canadian Association of Midwives is supporting the development of midwifery in South Sudan.

Canadian midwives have visited South Sudan to provide mentoring to recent midwifery graduates, support development and adaptation of education curricula, and foster association strengthening.



South Sudan statistics

Population:

12 million, approximately 90% rural
