Estimated revenues from wildlife trafficking, including the vast trade in illegal timber and fisheries resources, place it fourth on the list of transnational criminal activities.

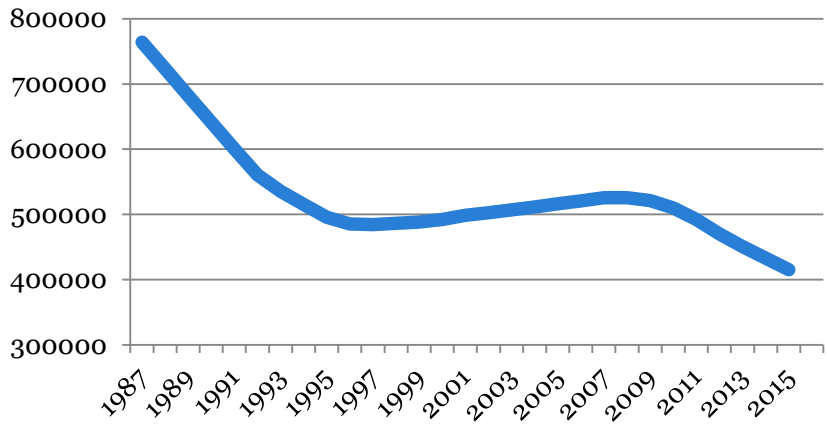

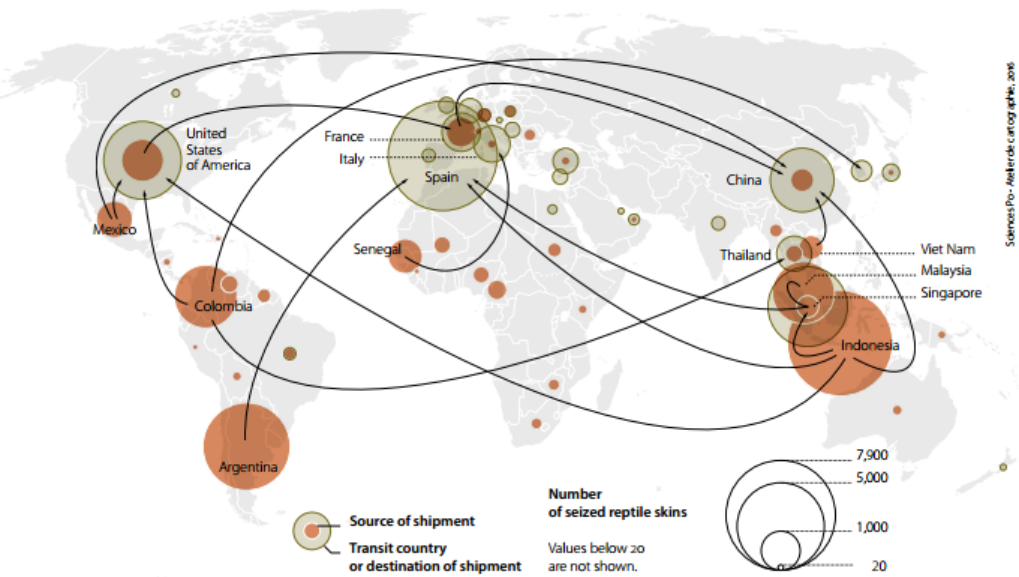

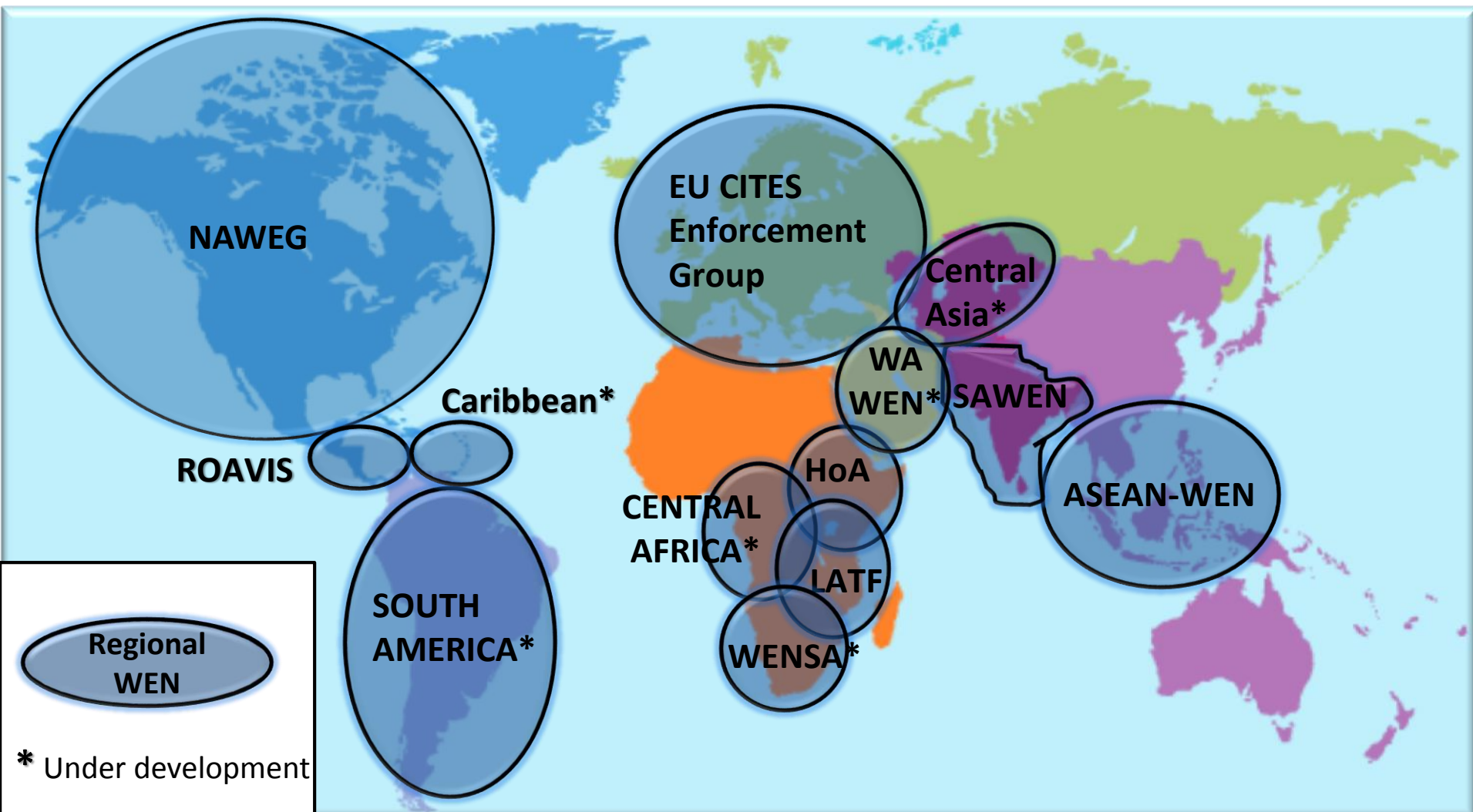
