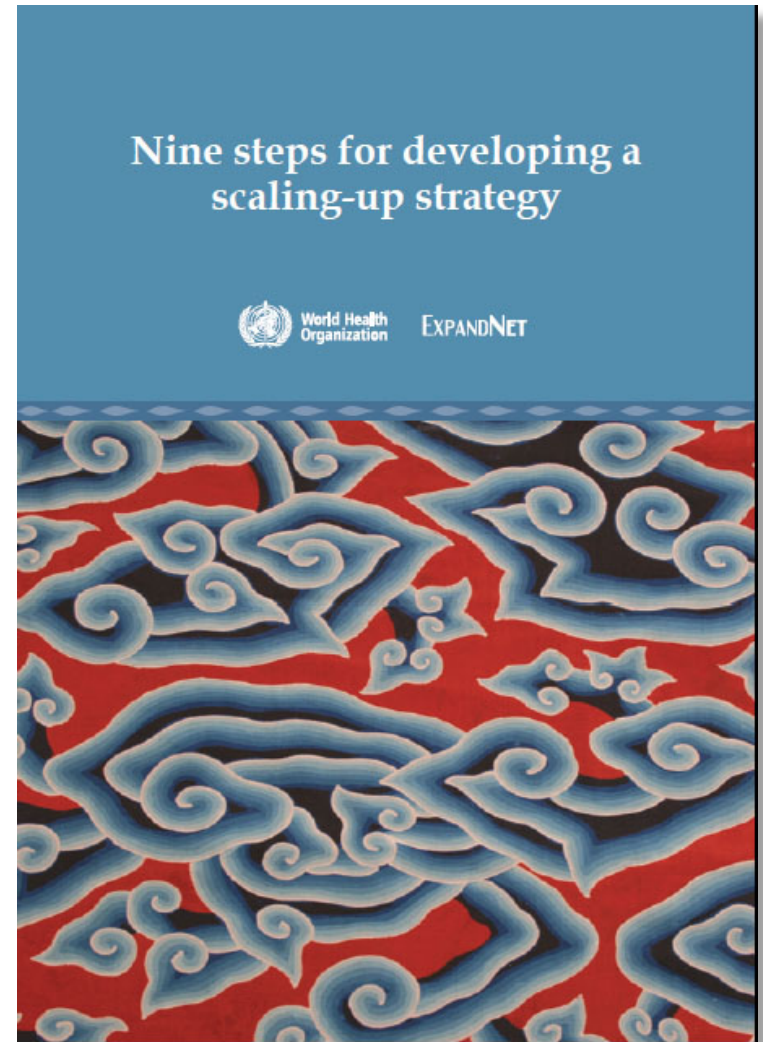
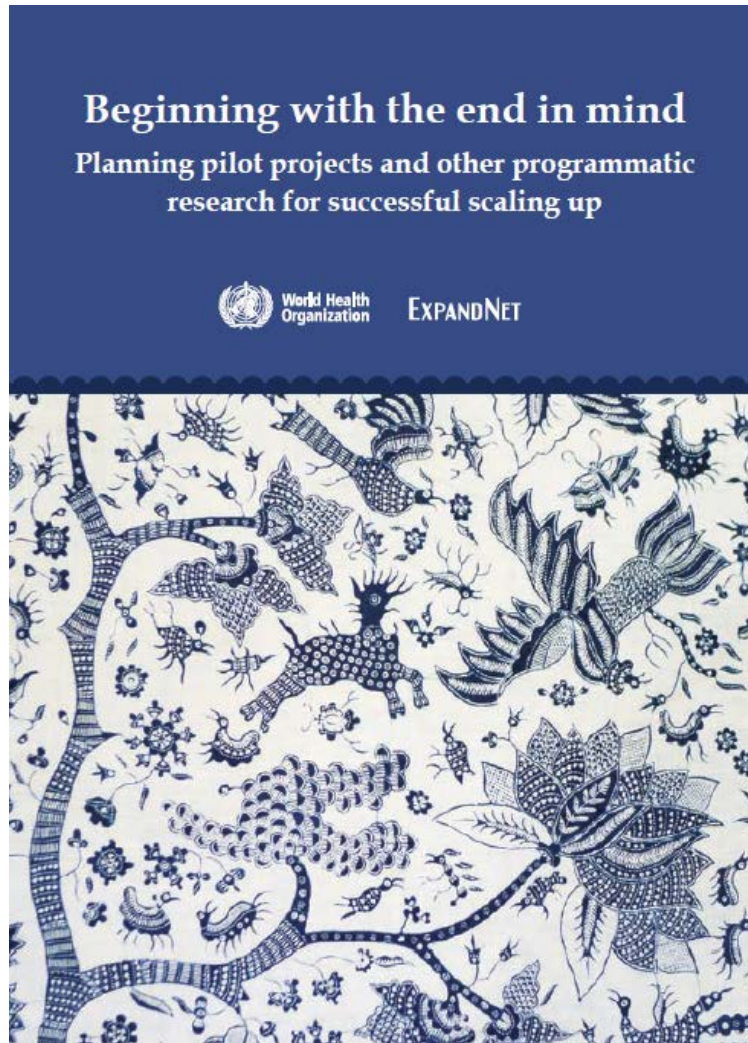

# How HoPE's PHE integrated approach represents a promising strategy for implementing the Sustainable Development Goals in East Africa

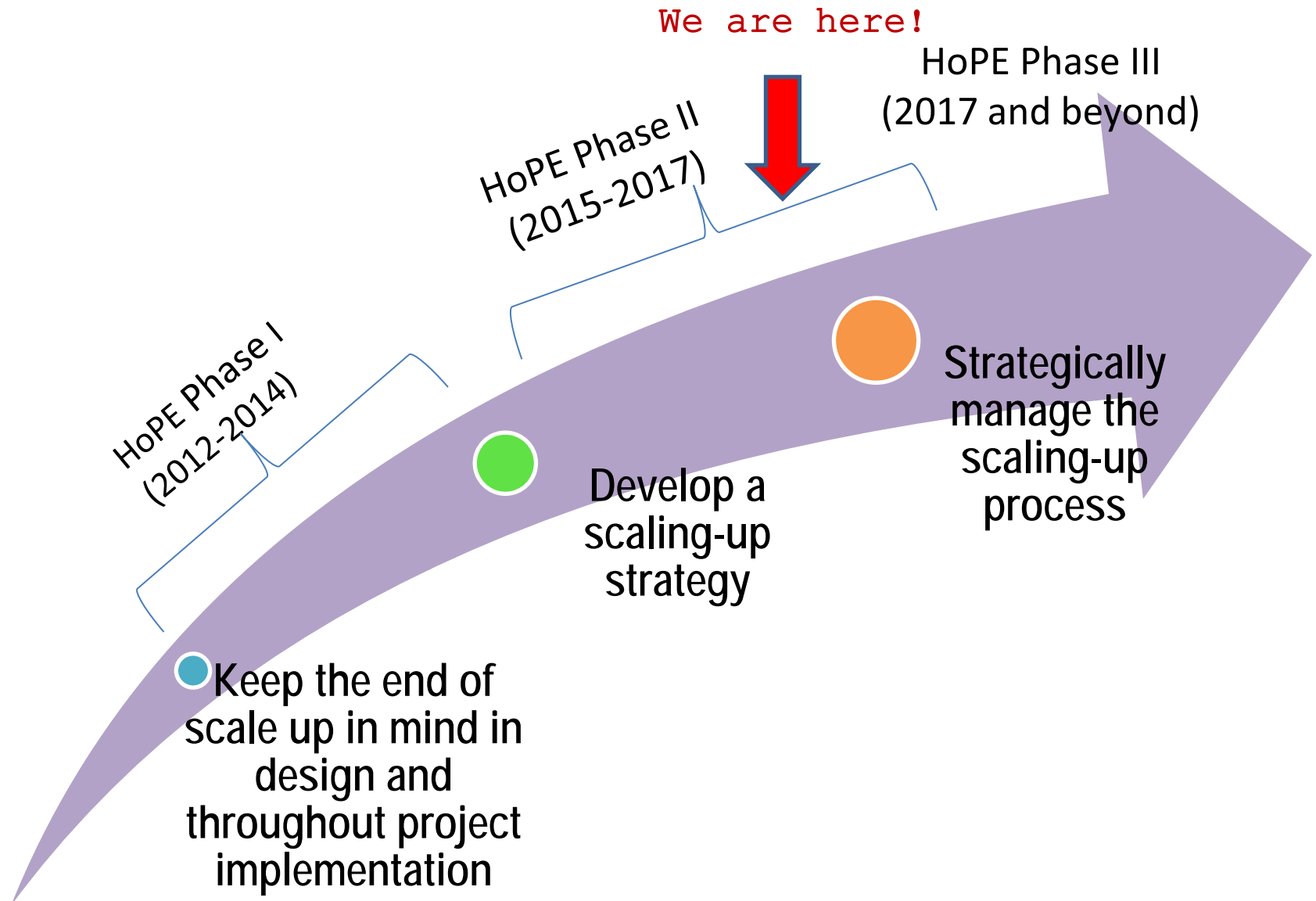





# ExpandNet/WHO guidance on scaling up used by the HoPE Initiative

# Key outcomes from HoPE's advocacy and multi-stakeholder scaling up strategy development workshops (UGANDA)

- Adoption of the Model Household concept by Ministry of Health
- Mende model village established by Wakiso District, with minimal support from HoPE-LVB
- Mayuge District started a PHE association to raise funding for their own model village in Nkombe
- Conducted assessment and orienting staff of two local organizations on HoPE interventions
- Climate change policy Uganda includes PHE



# Examples of key outcomes from HoPE's multi-stakeholder scaling up strategy development workshops (KENYA)

- Homa Bay and Siaya Counties established PHE steering committees
- Steering committees incorporated and budgeted for PHE implementation in their five-year County Integrated Development Plans
- Joint (HoPE/NEMA) concept note developed to incorporate a PHE focus into their “green initiatives” with CBOs

# HoPE's efforts to share learning on systematic scale up...

- Toolkit to assist others to adopt and implement HoPE integrated approaches
- Technical exchange visits with allied initiatives
- Reaching new donors and stakeholders to gain interest in implementing PHE
- Continue working with the LVB Commission of the EAC to institutionalize PHE
