
- >The relevance of extensive disaster risk
- The existing gap between national policies, existing plans and local knowledge and implementation
- > The striking lack of means of implementation beyond national levels
- The need for citizen-generated data for corroborate or challenge official reporting







Views from the Frontline – taking it one step









Inclusive risk governance is central to strengthening livelihood resilience

Climate Resilience "Inclusive risk governance Conflict **Disaster** resilience/ Resilience







Vfl 2017 – an independent people-centered monitoring mechanism

- Contributes to local baselines for Sendai Framework, SDGs, Paris Agreement
- Evidence-base to hold official reports accountable
- Information generated to inform local strategies, policies and plans
- Leveraged entry point for citizen engagement in policy discourse

- Key informants: At-risk people; Government authorities; Civil society
- Target 50 countries (UN 5:10:50 Partnership Countries)
- Estimated Budget (50 countries): US\$ 5.0 million (US \$70,000 100'000 / country)
- Estimated implementation time frame until GPDRR 2019


