

The Future of Intelligence

with Reid Morden

Since 9/11, both the Canadian and American governments have heightened their focus on intelligence. Many assume this change will result in increased security for North Americans. Will it? What are we giving up to feel safe? What are the ethical boundaries for this intelligence work – and do they differ depending on what side of the border you live? What does this increased emphasis on intelligence mean for the bilateral relationship between Canada and the United States? Have our intelligence priorities changed in this relationship?

These questions and many more will be probed by **Reid Morden** at the first 2005 Couchicing Round Table of the season on **November 8**. Mr. Morden is the president of Reid Morden & Associates and the executive director of the Independent Inquiry Committee into the United Nations Oil-for-Food Program. He has served as a senior public servant, as director of the Canadian Security Intelligence Service, as deputy minister of Foreign Affairs and as president and CEO of Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd.
