
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Summary

Background Unintended pregnancy and abortion estimates document trends in sexual and reproductive health and Lancet Glob Health 2020 autonomy. These estimates inform and motivate investment in global health programmes and policies. Variability in the availability and reliability of data poses challenges for measuring and monitoring trends in unintended pregnancy and abortion. We developed a new statistical model that jointly estimated unintended pregnancy and abortion that aimed to better inform efforts towards global equity in sexual and reproductive health and rights.

Key findings on unintended pregnancy and abortion worldwide

Unintended pregnancy and abortion are experiences shared by millions of people around the world

Unintended pregnancy and abortion occur where abortion is broadly legal and where abortion is restricted

In developing countries, abortion tends to be unsafe and health systems lack capacity to provide essential abortion services



Worldwide, 121 million unintended pregnancies and 73 million abortions occurred each year, 2015-2019


48% of pregnancies were unintended

61% of unintended pregnancies ended in abortion



Unintended pregnancy and abortion occur across all country income groups


2015-2019 rate

Evidence for 1.6 billion women of reproductive age in 132 low- and middle-income countries (LMICs)


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
Modern contraceptive use has increased over time, but many women still have an unmet need for modern methods

Investing in sexual and reproductive health care would dramatically reduce unintended pregnancies, unsafe abortions and maternal deaths

Every \$1 spent on contraceptive services beyond the current level would save \$3 in the cost of maternal, newborn and abortion care **because contraception reduces unintended pregnancies**

Potential annual impacts from COVID-19-related disruptions in sexual and reproductive health services

Disruption in essential SRH care	Impact
10% decline in use of short- and long-acting, reversible contraception	 49 million additional women with unmet need for modern contraceptives 15 million additional unintended pregnancies
10% decline in pregnancy-related and newborn care	 1.7 million additional women experiencing major obstetric complications without care 28,000 additional maternal deaths 2.6 million additional newborns experiencing major complications without care 168,000 additional newborn deaths
10% shift in abortions from safe to unsafe	 3.3 million additional unsafe abortions 1,000 additional maternal deaths
