This was a tumultuous year in Argentina, from the government's unexpectedly strong performance in the [midterms](#) to its hair-raising [peso crisis](#) to its celebrated [hosting](#) of the [G-20 summit](#). Through it all, we provided cutting-edge analysis in our publications, podcasts and public events, helping our audiences make sense of complex [political](#) and [economic](#) subjects, including the largest-ever International Monetary Fund [bailout](#) and the “*cuadernos*” [megascandal](#).

Leading journalists regularly turned to us for expertise, featuring our insights on National Public Radio, The New York Times, The Financial Times, CNN, the BBC, Bloomberg, The Los Angeles Times and Argentina's La Nación and Clarín. Influential publications now also rely upon [polling data](#) from our [survey](#), the Wilson Center/Poliarquía **ArgentinaPulse**, which sheds light on public opinion in Argentina regarding international issues.

We provided [further analysis](#) in our [newsletter](#), the [Weekly Asado](#), including articles and graphics on topics ranging from the [World Cup](#) to U.S.-Argentine commercial disputes to [labor relations](#). To help policymakers, investors and others recognize Argentina's principle opportunities and challenges, we hosted a series of high-profile [public events](#), including conversations with Argentina's [labor](#) and security ministers. We also launched a forum featuring candidates in next year's presidential election, beginning with a [headline-grabbing interview](#) with Sergio Massa. Finally, we organized the launch of the first-ever [Argentina Caucus](#) in the U.S. House of Representatives, convening prominent U.S. and Argentine lawmakers to celebrate the milestone and explore potential collaborations.
